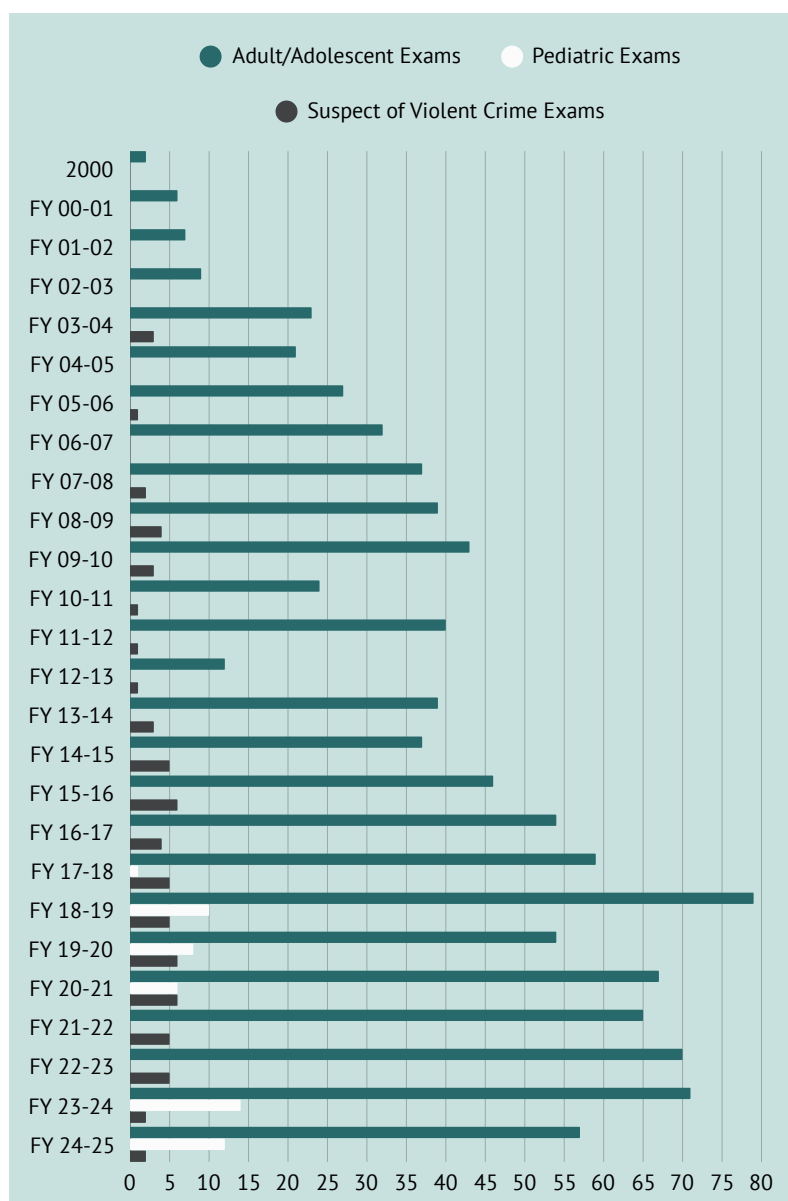

# History of St. Croix Valley Sexual Assault Response Team

St. Croix Valley SART began when task force members Ann Gustafson, St. Croix County Victim Witness Specialist; Barb LaVigne, Social Worker, Baldwin Area Medical Center; and Pam Bellrichard, Pierce County Victim Witness Specialist, learned about Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) providing expert care to victims of sexual assault.

St. Croix Valley SART was formed to be an independent entity, which allowed services to be provided in multiple hospital settings. SCV-SART began providing medical forensic exams to victims/survivors of sexual assault in Pierce and St. Croix Counties in 2001. The SART Center, a free, comprehensive victim services center, was developed and opened in October 2006. The SART Center provided a community-based site for victims of sexual assault and interpersonal violence. The SART center also offered confidential 24-hour telephone services. This was the first independent, non-profit, comprehensive victim treatment center in the Midwest to provide both SANE forensic services and Victim Advocacy. For the first time in western Wisconsin, there was an alternative to hospital-based Emergency Rooms care after a sexual assault occurred.

St. Croix Valley SART has continued to grow, adding new programs, services, and care locations over the years to better serve survivors of sexual violence. We have added many additional hospital partnerships in multiple new counties, 2 additional non-hospital community based sites, as well as multiple partnering advocacy agencies, and a violence prevention education program. Our goal is to not only respond to interpersonal violence with trauma informed forensic nursing care, but to reduce and prevent violence within our communities through resources and education.

# About Us



St. Croix Valley Sexual Assault Response Team is a 501c3 non-profit; providing medical exams, forensic evidence collection, outreach and violence prevention education for survivors of all ages of interpersonal violence, strangulation, human trafficking and sexual exploitation in Barron, Pierce, Polk, Rusk, and St. Croix counties in Wisconsin, and Goodhue County in Minnesota. We are staffed by an Executive Director, Operational Manager, Community Outreach & Prevention Education Coordinator, Forensic Nurse Coordinator, Forensic Nurse Supervisor, Forensic RNs, and countless volunteers.

## MISSION

Our Mission is to improve community health and safety by providing comprehensive services and resources that respond to and prevent interpersonal violence. St. Croix Valley Sexual Assault Response Team works to end sexual violence through providing comprehensive support and medical services to Victim/Survivors as well as encouraging and teaching social change. We believe through proactive education we can change societal norms and beliefs that allows sexual violence to continue to be perpetrated in our society.

### New streamlined access to follow up care:

Most survivors of assault have a lot to deal with in the aftermath. The emotional trauma makes it hard to focus on legal, medical and financial follow up. One of the main things that gets forgotten or delayed is the follow-up medical care.

This year we have partnered with 6 local Health Department's Reproductive Health programs to provide access to this care. Together with Pierce and St. Croix counties staff we developed a referral/release form that our patients can sign. A nurse will call them and help them schedule an appointment for STI and Pregnancy testing and any other medical or supportive care. We provide a list of the services the patient might need so that they don't need to retell the assault.

In the spring of this year, we provided a SANE exam for a young woman who had been sexually assaulted and strangled in an underserved northern county. She was referred to a hospital in a neighboring county where we provided services. Due to the nature of this assault, she was at high risk for STI/HIV transmission and delayed effects of the strangulation. The county Reproductive Health nurse closest to her, was sent a referral.

Care from a public health clinic is valuable for people without insurance or a medical provider, or those who can't or don't want to use their insurance or see their medical provider. The same nurse will do all the follow up and provide the confidentiality and continuity of care needed in post assault and strangulation care.

### Counseling Voucher Program:

St. Croix Valley SART's counseling voucher program supports survivors of sexual violence by providing access to and eliminating barriers around the cost of counseling and therapy.

This program allows survivors to gain relatively quick access to professional mental health support and counseling resources. St. Croix Valley SART covers the cost of professional licensed counselor therapy sessions for qualifying survivors. This program is made possible through community grants.

- Survivors find a provider of their choosing, and coordinate their individual care with the support of the advocacy coordinator.
- Survivors qualify for **5** sessions and can use up to **15** sessions per fiscal year.
- All survivors of sexual violence past or present can apply for the counseling voucher program. Priority is given to low-income, student, and uninsured survivors.
- **17** survivors have successfully completed the program between **2020-2025**.



# 2024-2025 Funding Challenges

In fiscal year 2024-2025 St. Croix Valley SART faced significant funding loss due to a decrease in federal VAWA (Violence Against Women Act) funding, which resulted in state decreased funding in VOCA (Victims of Crime Act).

VOCA funds supported our direct advocacy services program - the bridge between the forensic nursing examination and “what’s next” for sexual assault victim/survivors. Due to this funding loss, under the direction of the St. Croix Valley SART Board of Directors, SCV-SART closed its direct advocacy services program, as well as its Teen Support Group.

Additionally, SART lost funding from a major donor who had supported the organization for over 15 years, resulting in a 25% decrease in its operational budget.

Under the direction of the SCV-SART’s Board of Directors we applied for and received one-time funding from WIS ACT 241, allowing for a transition from direct advocacy services and towards violence prevention education programming and maintaining staff.

The overall loss of funding could have been proven to be detrimental as the organization faced the possibility of closing our physical location, which not only allows staff to work as a team collaboratively and cohesively, but is where we see and provide care for pediatric victim/survivors and 15-20% of our adult/adolescent victim/survivor patients. Due to the generosity of the Fred C. and Katherine B. Andersen Foundation, a one-time bridge funding opportunity was received to address funding gaps and support the organization’s resiliency.

SART’s violence prevention education program funding from WIS ACT 241 has ended as of June 30, 2025.

After extensive research in-house by staff and a professional grant writer, there are no funding opportunities available for violence prevention education. With no grant funding available, a decision will need to be made on the continuation of this unique and impactful program that aligns with SART’s mission and vision.

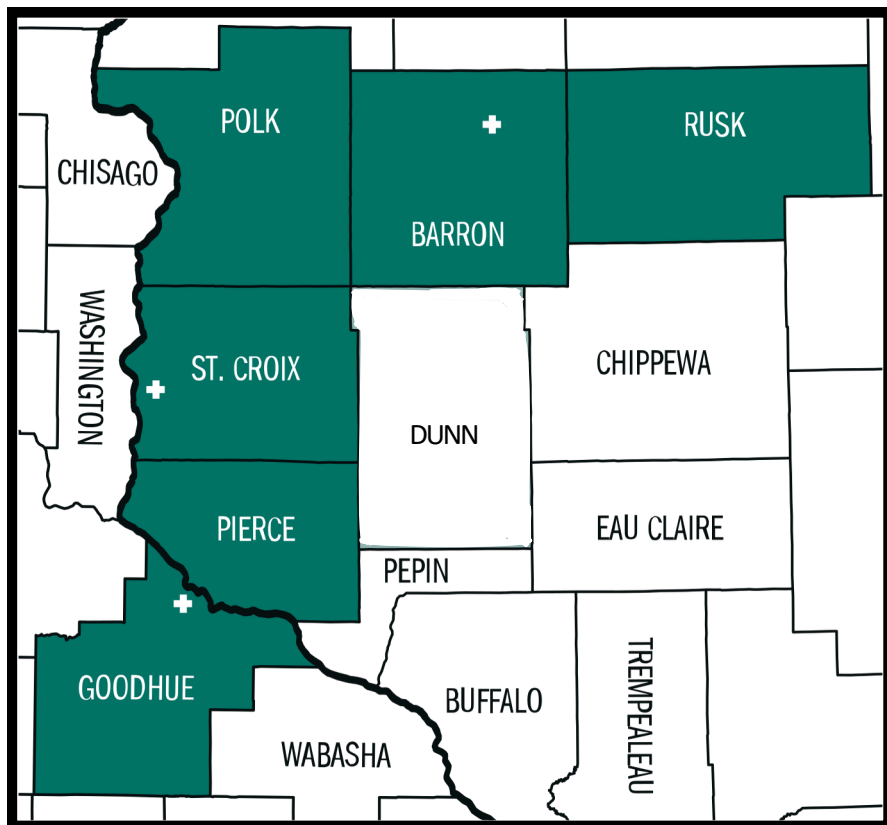

# Nursing

St. Croix Valley SART nurses are dedicated to their community, learning, and providing victims of violence with the most compassionate and knowledgeable care possible. Our nurses come from a variety of backgrounds and locations. We are privileged enough to benefit from all of their varied experiences in care and it makes our staff not only well rounded but appreciative of caring for the whole patient. We have been very fortunate to be able to add to our talented nursing staff this year and are reaching all six areas of our coverage to allow for less patient wait time and more accessible care.

## ◆ Adolescent/Adult Exams

Our nurses provide medical, forensic and post assault care for all ages starting at 13. This may include a medical history and exam, evidence collection of DNA, toxicology, clothing, and documentation of injuries. We offer medications to prevent pregnancy, infection, and referrals to support services and medical follow-up. Through trauma informed care we give the control back to the survivor by encouraging their participation in the process and decisions being made. This begins the road to healing.

## ◆ Pediatric Exams

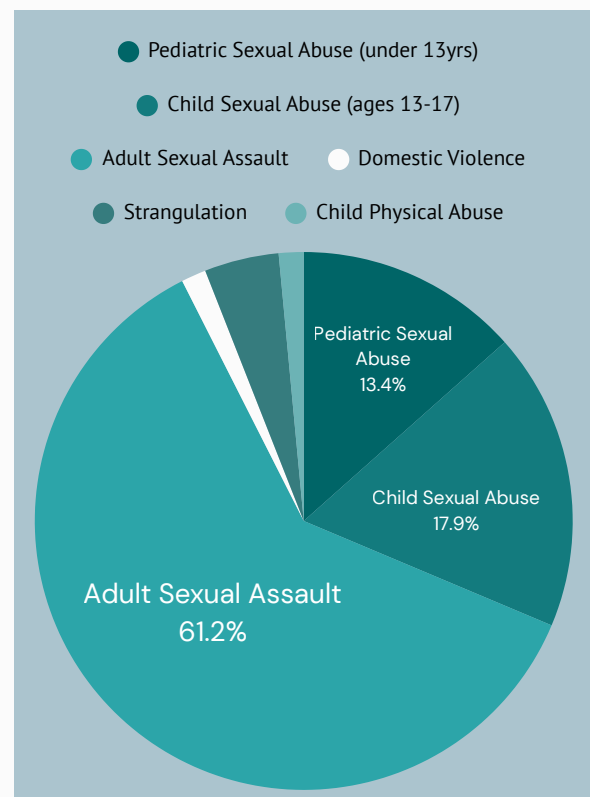
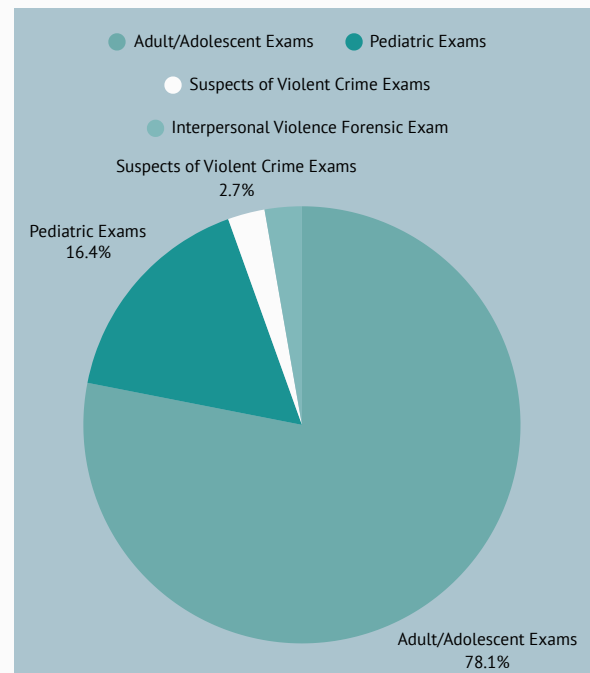
Children receive all the care and respect given to older patients. Their choices and comfort guide the exam, and family is involved in the process as much as possible. Our nurses have undergone special training, and two advocates are present during the exam to meet the needs of the child and their family. These exams are scheduled and done in the calm of our community-based exam sites in Hudson and Rice Lake.

## ◆ Strangulation Exams

Every patient is assessed for strangulation. There has been a rise in strangulation with sexual assaults and domestic violence. Recent research is showing long term physical and cognitive negative effects of strangulation. It has also been shown to signal a higher risk for homicide in the future. If strangulation has been identified medical evaluation and care is provided in an Emergency Department and follow up support is provided.

## ◆ Suspects of Violent Crime Exams

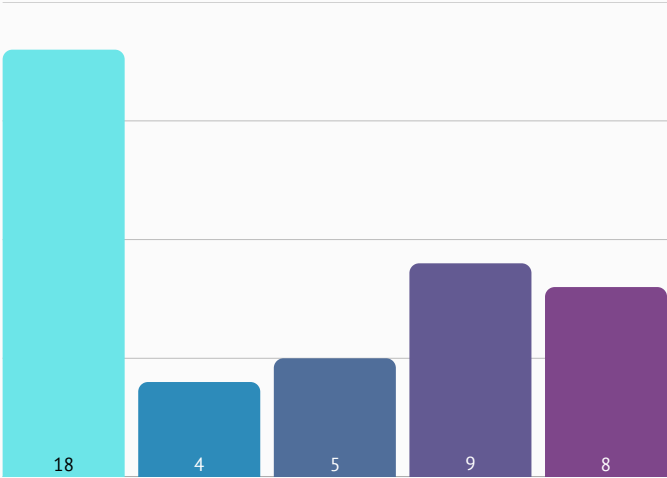
Medical forensic exams are respectfully provided at the request of law enforcement for suspects of sexual assault and other violent crimes. We collect a medical history and forensic evidence based on a search warrant and/or the suspect's consent.



# Nursing Demographics

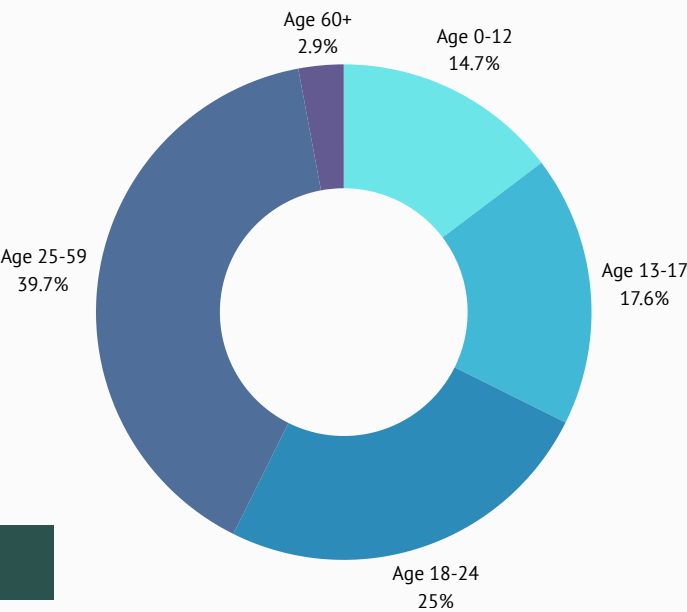
2024-2025 demographics of victim/survivors served via forensic medical exams

- Number of exams served a survivor of domestic violence

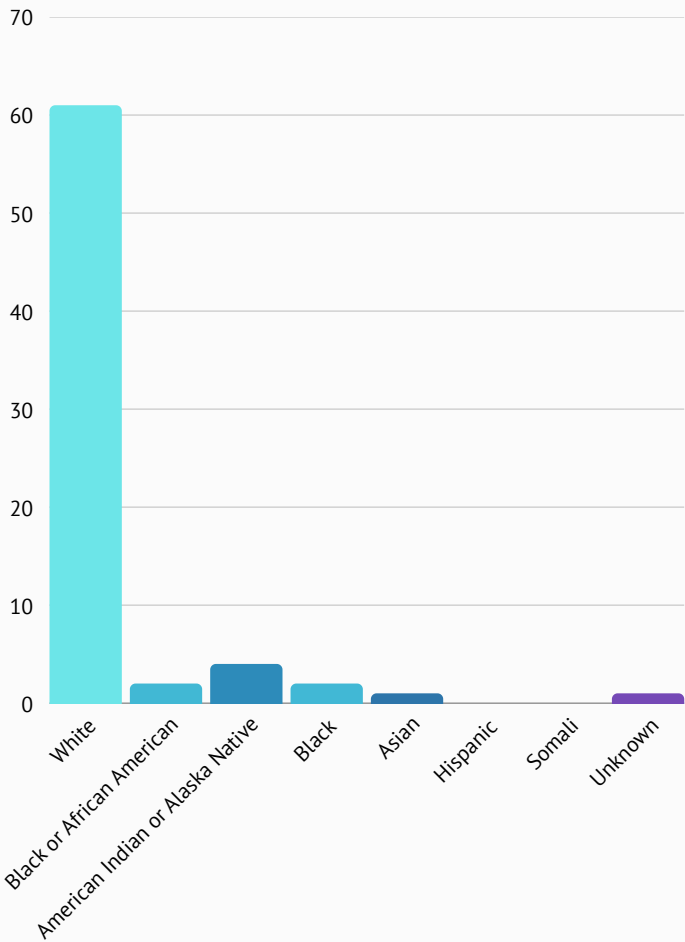

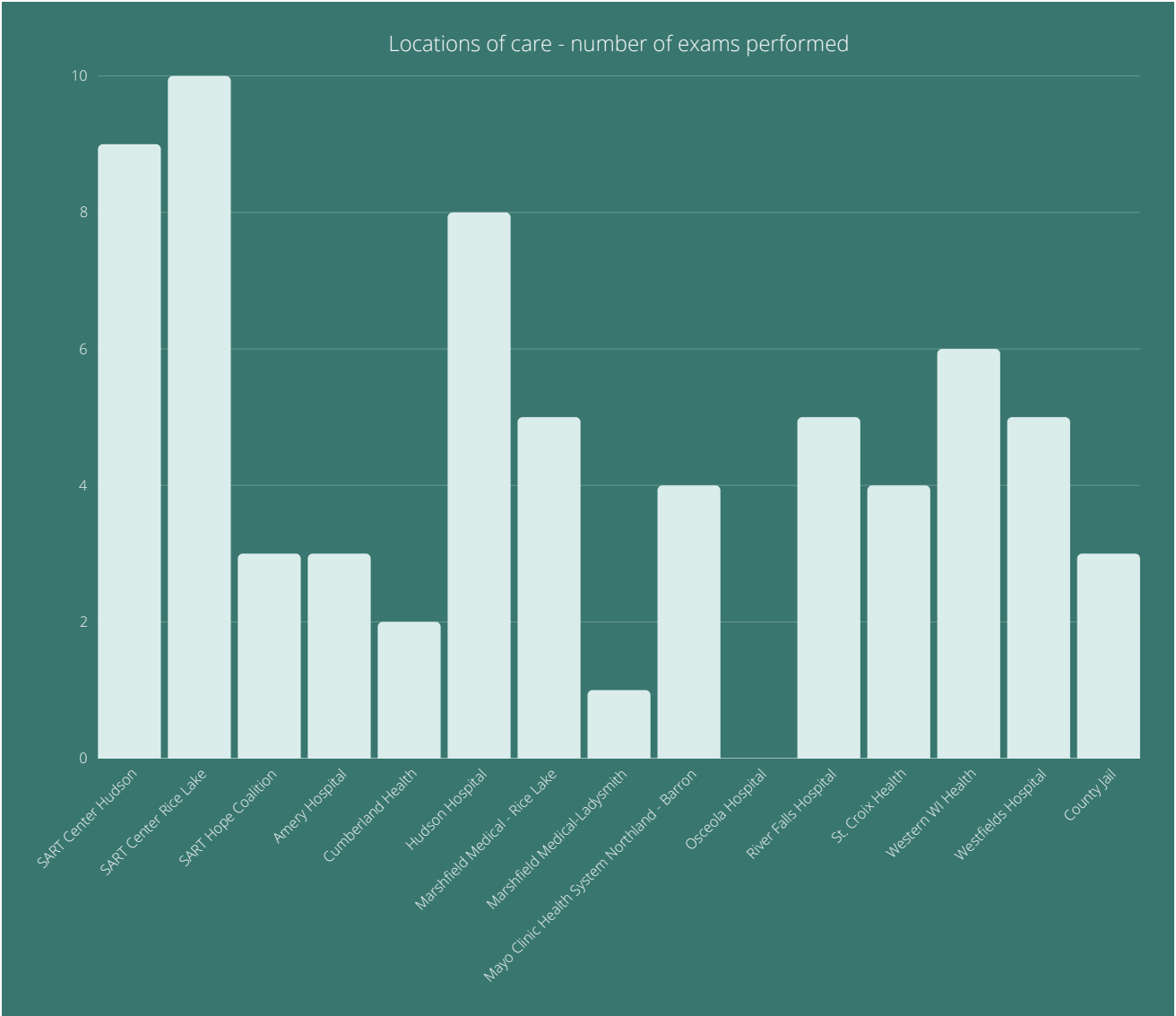
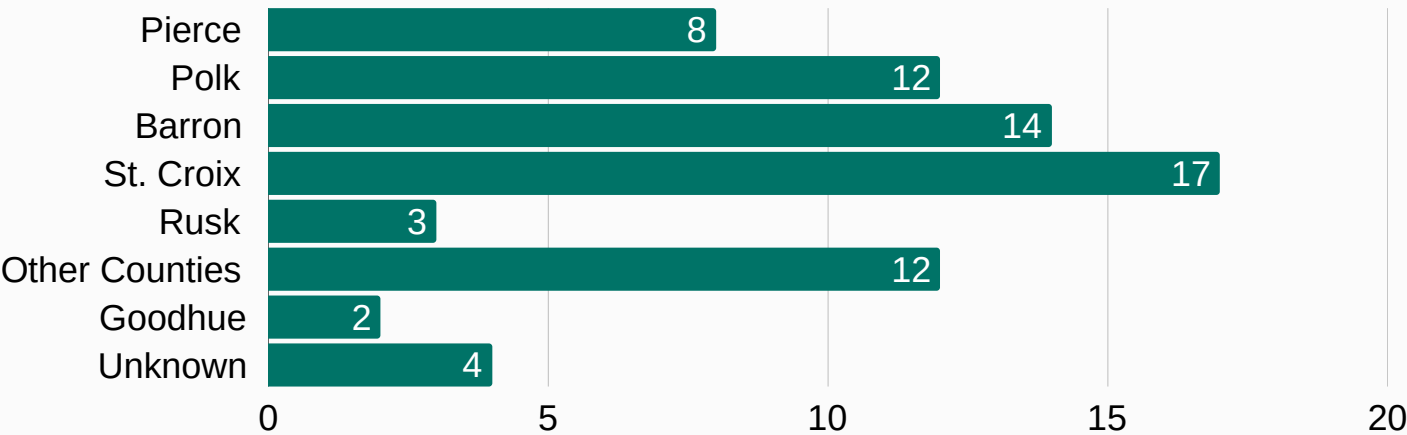
Ages of Victim/Survivors served



Race/Ethnicity

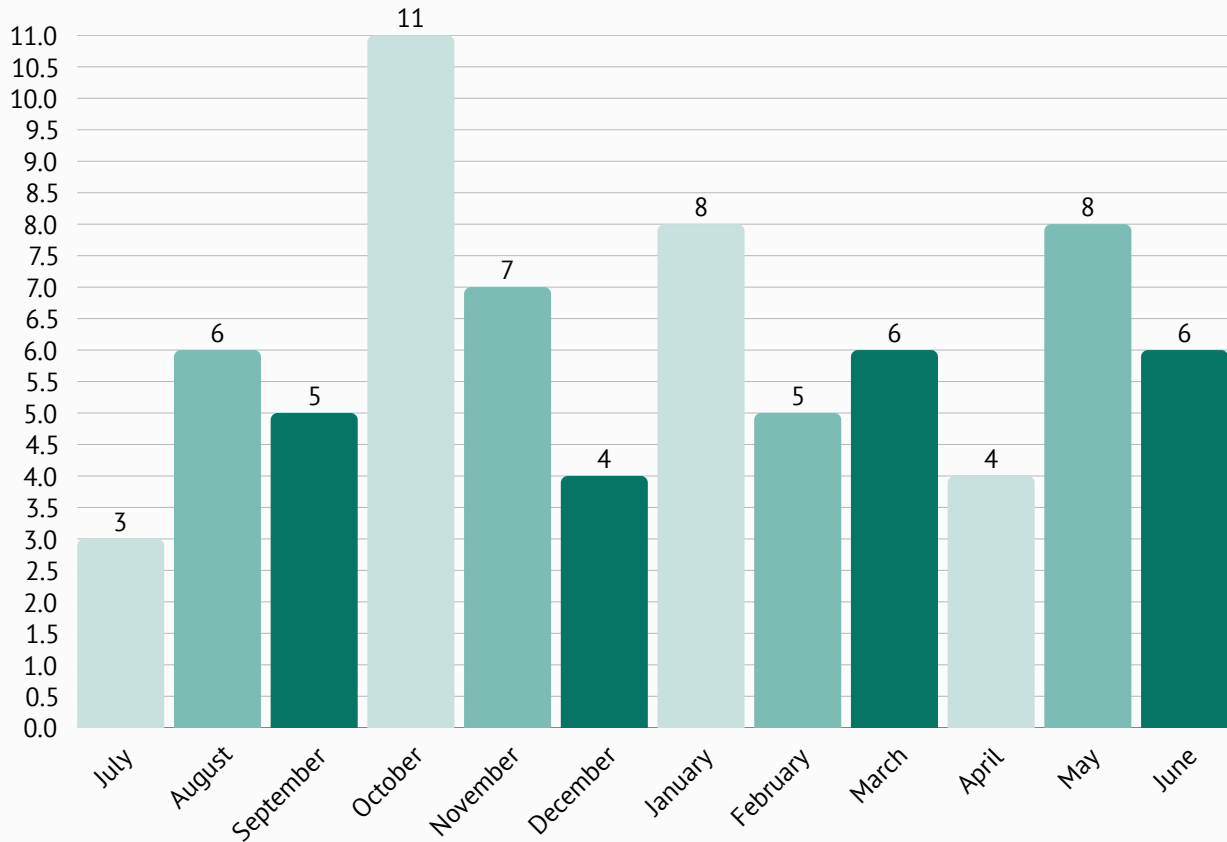


# Victim/Survivors Served - County Residency



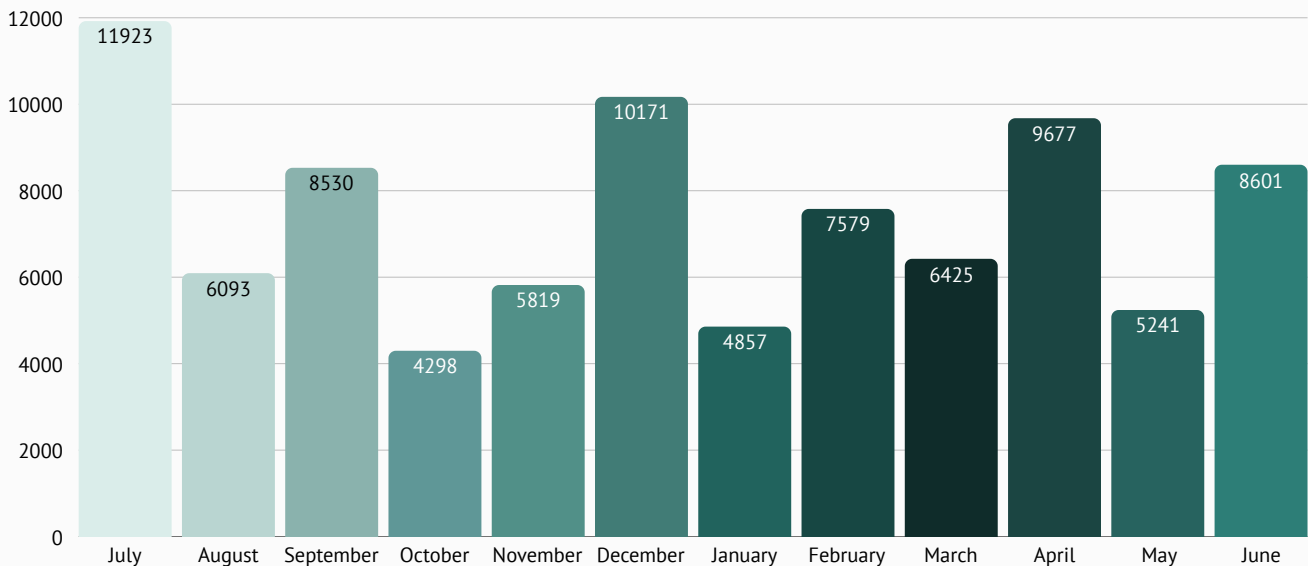


Number of forensic exams per month



## Cost Per Exam

The average cost per exam in FY 2024-2025 was \$6,700 based on general operating expenses for the fiscal year. St Croix Valley SART was reimbursed \$1,545.10 by the WI SAFE Fund (23% of actual cost) and \$1,486 by the State of MN (22%). If St. Croix Valley SART's actual costs were taken into consideration when states are determining their respective state's reimbursement rate of 2/3 of cost, SART would receive \$4,422.

## SAFE Fund

Administered by the Wisconsin Department of Justice, the SAFE (Sexual Assault Forensic Exam) Fund provides reimbursement to healthcare providers for the cost of sexual assault forensic examinations. The current reimbursement rate of \$1,545.10 is 2/3 of the cost based on hospital program expenses and does not take into consideration St. Croix Valley SART's cost per exam.

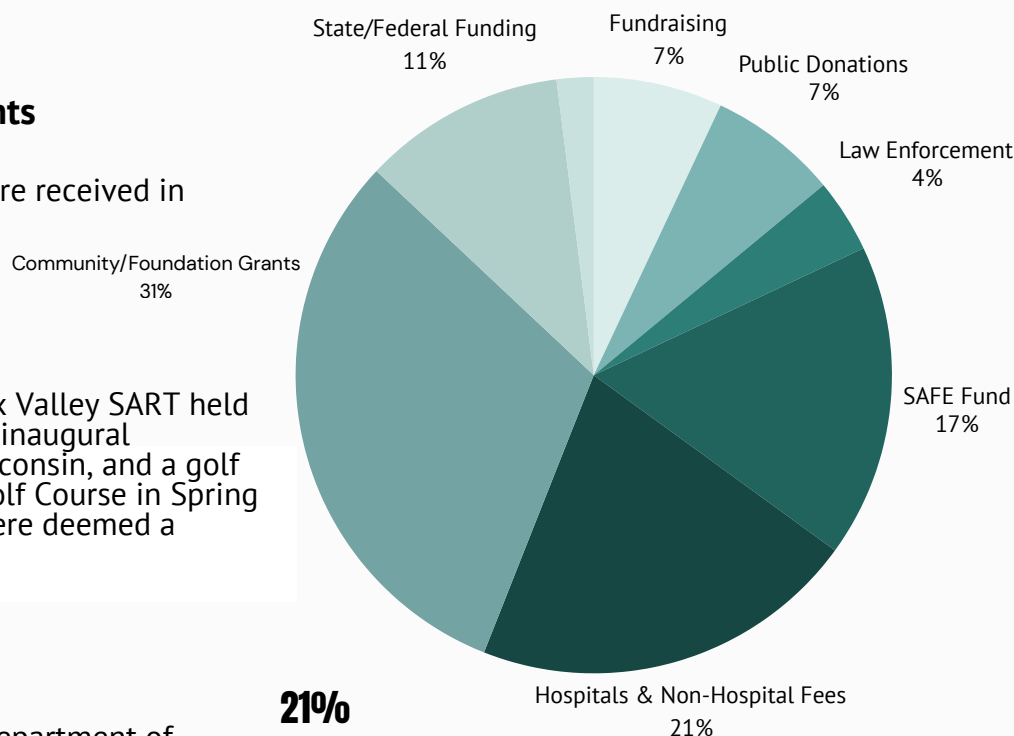
## Public Donations

## Law Enforcement

When a victim-survivor reports the crime to law enforcement, a \$250 fee is charged to the reporting agency for on-going consultation, immediate access to records, and to provide factual and expert testimony.

## Hospital/Non-Hospital Fees

St. Croix Valley SART contracted with eleven Emergency Department partners in four counties in Western WI: Barron, Polk, Rusk, and St. Croix. SART also contracts with the Goodhue County SMART (Sexual Assault Multi-Disciplinary Action Response Team) to provide services located within the Hope Coalition's Outreach offices in Red Wing, MN.

## State/Federal Funding

SART's VOCA (Victims of Crime Act) funding, which supported the in-house medical advocacy program, ended on September 30, 2024. The Board of Directors approved the transition from in-house advocacy to prevention education, with SART applying for and receiving a one-time funding opportunity from the State of Wisconsin, "WIS ACT 241" to support this program, which was highly successful in the fiscal year.

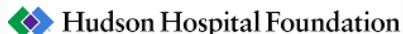

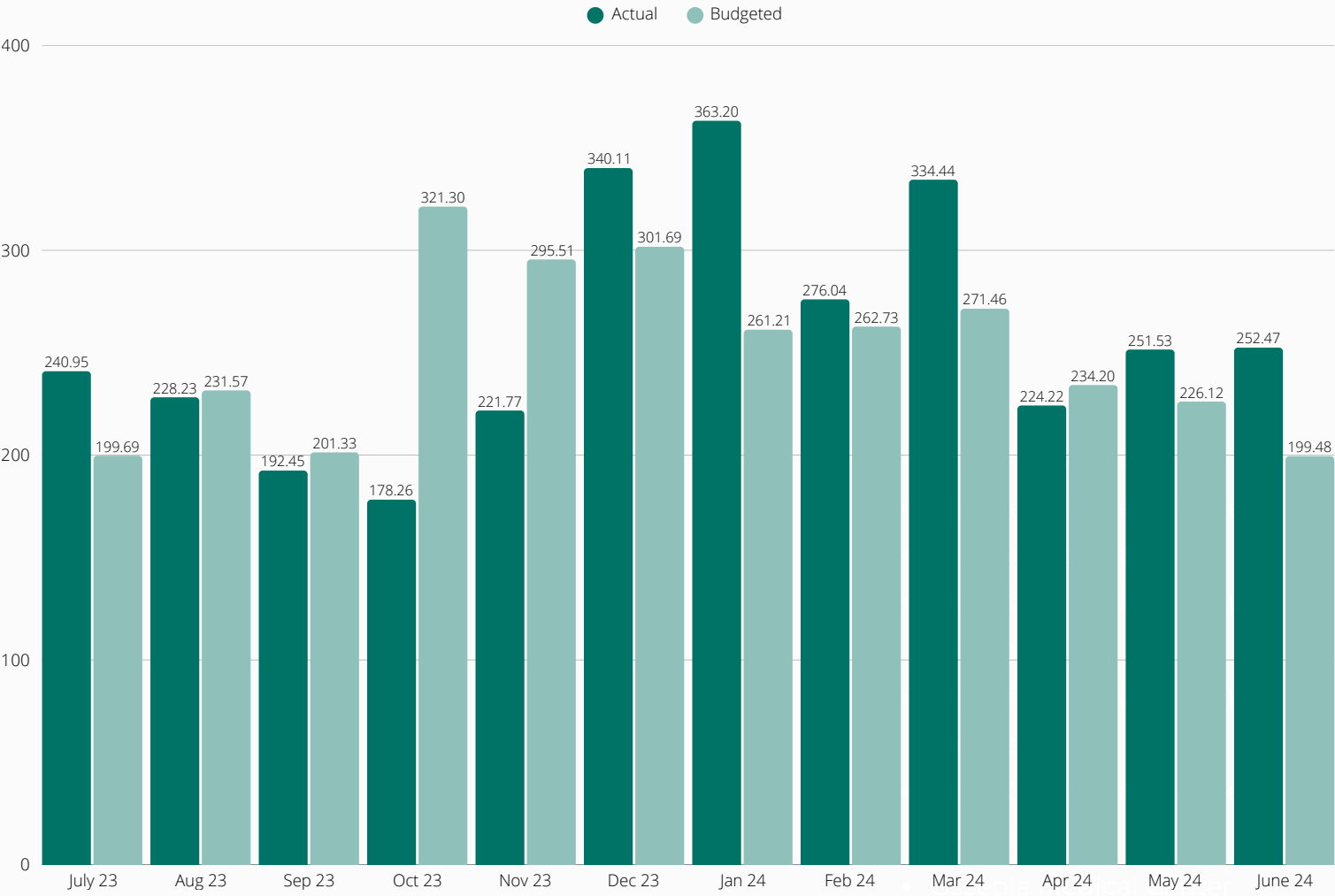

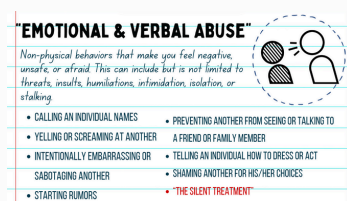

# Violence Prevention Education Program



St. Croix Valley SART offers no cost Violence Prevention Education programming and partnership to schools and universities in Barron, Pierce, Polk, & St. Croix counties. Our presentations educate students about the following topics:

- Healthy Relationships and Boundaries
- Defining the forms of violence: emotional, physical, sexual, technology, stalking, etc.
- Consent: How to express or receive a “no”, when to ask for consent and what the ask should include.
- Wisconsin State Laws on Consent, Sexting, Child Pornography, etc.
- Myths around sexual violence and dating violence
- How to support a friend who is experience dating violence or sexual violence
- Community resources available to survivors and age appropriate books and media to learn more

We believe this proactive and preventative approach allows students to process and identify the concept and actions of interpersonal violence in a safe learning environment. Preventive education is known to be an important and effective tool in reducing the volume of sexual and interpersonal violence in our local communities.

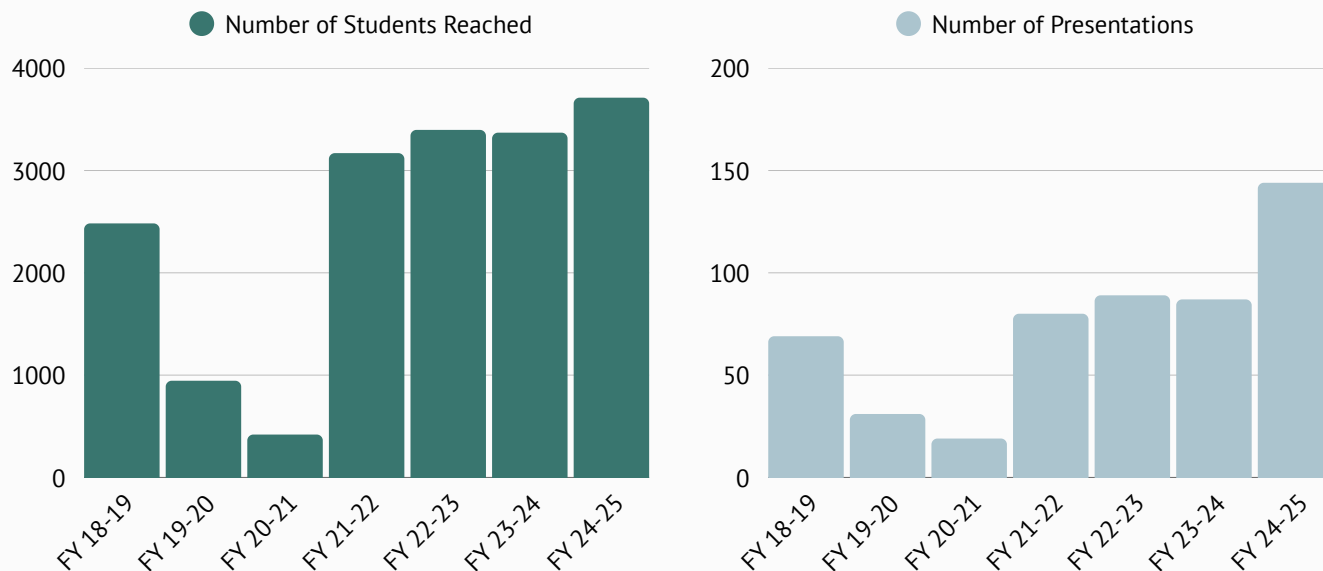
